## Off-Season Policies

As of October 1st and continuing through April 30, 2017, guest times are lifted. However, the twice per month guest restrictions are still in effect. The lottery and tee times remain in effect through the off-season. Gangsomes are not in effect until November 1st except by Golf Pro Shop discretion. A gangsome is up to six (6) players in a group. We ask that all gangsomes be respectful to foursomes whenever possible. **Gangsomes rules in effect- 1) Continuous putting- Each player must continue putting until the ball is holed or the putt is conceded. NO MARKING THE GOLF BALL 2) All players must ride in a gangsome unless course demand is minimal. When joining a group to make 5 or 6, make sure that all players are willing to ride before adding yourself to a group.** If you have any questions, please call the Golf Professional Staff for assistance.

The golf course was busy as always; and the No. 7 renovation of the new tee box and retaining wall was completed on schedule and on budget. I commend our various Committees and the Board for their diligence and foresight they have displayed this past winter, spring, and summer to approve these enhancements that make Lakewood a true gem in the Denver Metro area. Members can be proud of the product and services provided.
