letter from the president



SEPTEMBER 2018 – THE GOOD, THE BAD, THE NEEDS, and THE WANTS

Good bye summer of 2018! That was certainly fast and I cannot believe we are about to

finish the 3rd quarter of the year. For me as your President, September presents the opportunity for me to reflect on this past summer season where our Club is used the most by all of us Members and assess the good, the bad, the needs, and the wants. When looking for the good, I'm looking for where we have our best Member experiences and where our service and facilities meet or exceed expectations. This provides a benchmark for me to establish formulas for success and where this can be applied to other areas in need of improvement. In looking for the bad, I must be honest in my assessment of where we may have failed you in your Member experience. Honest assessment allows for breaking down the process or situation and learning from our mistakes in order to apply successful formulas learned through our assessment of the good. Needs vs Wants ... this is a question we address every year at the Board level in putting together our budget and analyzing our initiation fees and monthly dues. Every Committee in August and September is assessing its performance during the summer season and will put forth their Needs vs Wants in order to create our 2019 budget. All of us on your Board of Directors are approached throughout the year by many Members with ideas on how to provide a better Member experience. Many of these ideas are practical and applicable while others may be somewhat creative. It is our job

and responsibility as your representatives to determine what are Needs vs Wants. This is vital to our responsibility of the fiscal management of our Club. Examples of Needs start with our 11 year old Clubhouse and the required maintenance as this building continues to age with the wear and tear from full Membership. Our equipment needs to maintain our jewel of a golf course must be met every year. Ongoing technology upgrades are simply a fact of life and cost of doing business in this day and age. These are all considered needs for us to maintain the facilities and operations of Lakewood Country Club. Example of Wants would be expansion of our casual dining area in the Clubhouse, an improved snack shack on the golf course, Kids' Klub on Friday nights, or new bridges on #'s 7 and 18. Every Want is considered seriously and the Board tries to insert as many of these into our budget along with the many Needs that we face each year.

Drafts of the 2019 budget have been prepared and initial reviews are in process. Your Board of Directors are focused on wanting to create another exceptional experience for all of you in 2019. Many of the Needs are being addressed through recommendations by Facilities and Green Committee with intense scrutiny applied by Finance Committee. Long Range Planning Committee ("LRPC") is currently working on plans for an improved snack shack to be ready for the 2019 golf season. This snack shack will provide larger restroom facilities, broader menu items, and improved aesthetics to go along with our beautiful golf course much like the pump house on #18 tee box. LRPC is also working on plans for an expanded casual dining area in the clubhouse with an objective to begin dialogue with Membership in the spring of 2019 and targeted start date of January 2020.

This project must be approved by the Members and the Board will look for membership input through town hall meetings and other communication. The Board of Directors is tasked with approving all of these considerations and projects while also considering a reduction of debt through existing cash reserves while addressing the need for an increase in monthly dues. These two concepts of debt reduction and dues increase may appear to be contradictory but they're not when you consider short-term vs long-term impact to our financial condition and the ongoing operations of our Club.

As we end our busy summer season, my job as President now requires me to assess our performance and apply what I've learned in partnership with our dedicated Board of Directors. We are committed to provide quality services and Member experiences at all

times of the year while exercising fiscal responsibility. I encourage all Members to contact me or any Member of the Board with comments, ideas, concerns, etc as we enter this time of assessment and planning for 2019. In the meantime, enjoy our golf course during this spectacular time of year and jump into the pool on the weekends as we keep our pool open for all Members to enjoy on the weekends in September. Keep an eye on the events calendar as Programs Committee has some fun things in September and our Gala in October.







letter from the gm



Busy Club

Amazing how fast the summer months went by. Seems like we just opened the course from the restoration, when its been almost three months since we

opened all 18 holes.

The golf course has certainly seen its fair share of play with increased number of rounds over the last two years. The overall response from the Membership on the course changes has been overwhelmingly positive, and Chris Swim along with his Turf Care team have done a wonderful job in providing the Membership with excellent playing conditions all summer. While the course has seen a higher volume of play, you really can't see the effects volume can have on a golf course, thanks to Chris and his team.

The pool has also seen an uptick in volume over the summer months. The Members who utilize the pool seem to really enjoy the new furnishings, and the revised menu. For the three summer months the pool is open, it has generated close to the same amount of food and beverage revenue, as the Clubhouse. That is big volume, when you consider the average check at the pool for food and beverage is half of the average check inside the Clubhouse dining room.

With a full Membership, everyone seems to be taking advantage of what the Club has to offer and that can sometimes diminish the "Membership" experience when the facilities are so busy. The volume and service of so much volume is not being overlooked. All departments of the Club are preparing their budgets for 2019, and the man power to service higher volume will be considered

for every department. Payroll is our biggest expense at Lakewood, and I can promise you it will not diminish over the upcoming years. Our challenge will be to hire a caliber of an employee that understands the importance of Member experience, in a Denver job market that is hovering around 2% unemployment.

Much of the hospitality industry in Denver is struggling to find average people, let alone good people who understand service. Our payroll will increase in 2019, as we continue to search for people who value loyalty, respect, and dedication. Culinary staff, Waitstaff, Player Service staff, and Turf Care staff, have positions posted on the web and recruiting agencies year-round, and we must pay competitive wages in the hopes people will join our team. But it is not always just about the paycheck, work atmosphere, and benefits can go a long way in capturing talent. That is where the Membership can become vital in our success. A positive work environment, where staff is appreciated for the hard work they perform can trump financial compensation.

Lakewood CC is a fun and fast paced environment to be a part of. Sometimes the vibrant activity of the Club adds to the enjoyment for those using the bar, dining room, and pool. But too much volume will drive some away. We are striving to strike a balance of energy and enjoyment, vs. not enough seating, or loud and unruly business. While we want Lakewood to be fun, it is a Country Club, not a Fraternal organization.
